


Is your dog hiding something?


Dogs suffering from osteoarthritis (OA) don't tend to vocalise chronic pain and are able to subtly change the way they move to relieve the pressure on the affected joint. By the time symptoms of OA become obvious, such as visible stiffness in their movement, your dog may have been living with pain for some time. But there are signs you can look out for:




1. Restlessness at night
Does he or she keep you up at night trying to get comfortable?




2. Stiff after a lie down
Does he or she take a minute to "get going" after waking up from a snooze?



3. Lagging behind on a walk or reluctant to go at all
Has the leader become a straggler when out and about?




4. Difficulty on slippery or uneven surfaces
Has walking turned into scrabbling when navigating hard floors?



5. Trouble getting up the stairs, onto the sofa or into the car
Have every day activities become a bit more difficult?

Any one of these signs could mean your dog is dealing with joint stiffness which is commonly associated with OA. This practice can help them to feel more comfortable, please come and talk to us.



OA is estimated to affect approximately 20% of the adult dog population¹, but because the condition often progresses gradually and dogs are so good at hiding their pain, it can be really tough to spot.

OA is common, painful and prevents your dog from getting the most out of life. But by spotting the signs early and making some simple changes, you can help change that.
